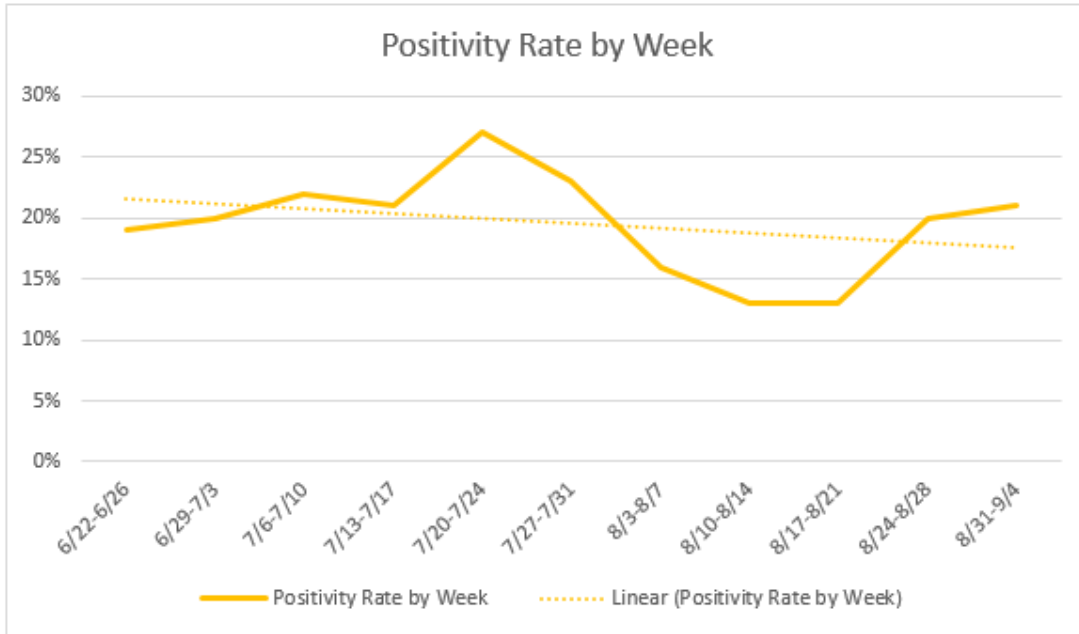

## **THE STATE OF COVID-19 IN FINNEY COUNTY, KANSAS**

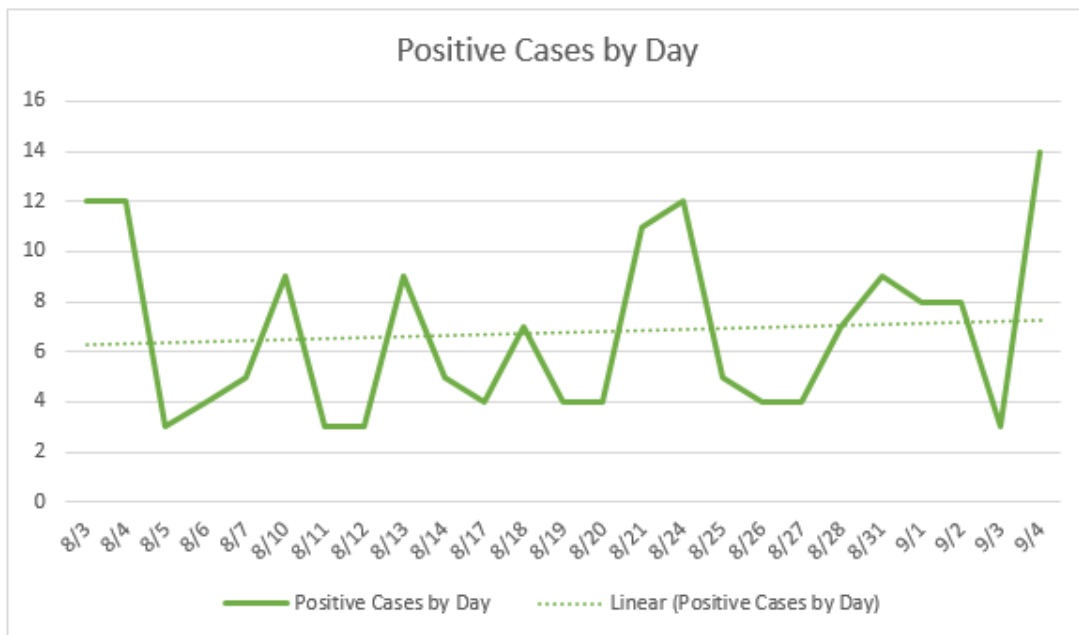
Finney County, Kansas – At the time of this update, there have been a total of 1,946 Finney County residents who have tested positive for COVID-19. Finney County Health Department is actively monitoring 99 cases, that is, the number of confirmed positive cases that have not yet been released from quarantine. There have been 4,190 negative tests, and 213 tests are still pending as of the time of this release. Three (3) individuals are currently hospitalized, and 12 Finney County residents have passed away due to COVID-19.

We regularly update our website, [www.finneycounty.org/coronavirus](http://www.finneycounty.org/coronavirus), Monday-Friday as new results are received from the state lab. You are also able to find a number of community resources, as well as additional graphs and a breakdown of positive cases by age and gender. The graphs below show the positive cases by day, hospitalizations by day, breakdown of the age ranges of positive cases by day, and the positivity rate by week with the data through September 4, as the week of August 31-September 4 is the most recent week we have received results from all COVID-19 tests performed that week. Weekend dates are not represented in the graphs as we do not perform tests or receive results on Saturday or Sunday.

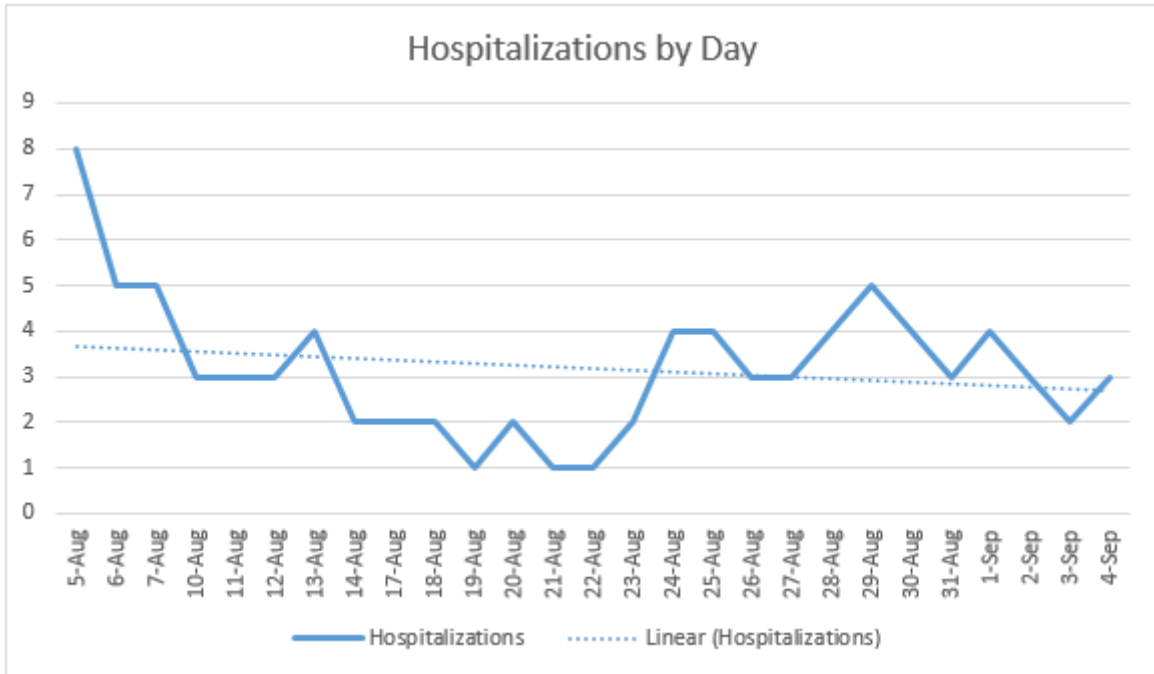

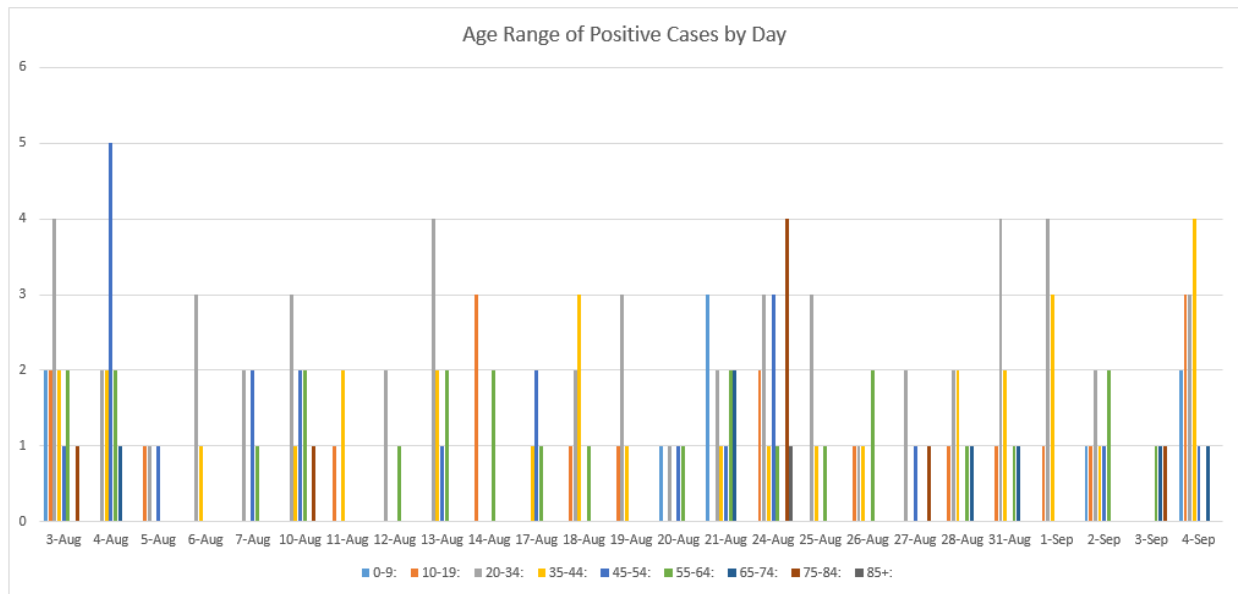
The solid yellow line in the above graph demonstrates the positivity rate (percentage of tests performed that were positive) by week. The dotted line demonstrates the trend of the positivity rate in Finney County.



The above graph demonstrates the number of cases that were positive from the tests of a particular day since the beginning of August through September 4. The dotted line represents the trend of positives in Finney County.



The above graph demonstrates the number of patients who are hospitalized at St. Catherine Hospital with COVID-19 on a particular day.



The above graph demonstrates the age breakdown of positive cases by day. Each bar represents a different age bracket as broken down by the KDHE in COVID-19 reporting.
