

PUBLIC NOTICE

Accessibility of SARA Title III Hazardous Substance Information

Section 324 of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act, also known as SARA Title III (Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986, PL 99-499), requires public notice at least once annually to inform the public of the means to access information about extremely hazardous substances that are manufactured, stored, or used within their community. Follow-up emergency notices may subsequently be issued if necessary.

What This Means for Finney County

The Finney County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) is responsible for coordinating hazardous materials planning and ensuring the community has access to important information. As part of this requirement, the following information is available to the public:

- LEPC meeting schedules and activities
 - SARA Title III hazardous materials planning, included in the **Finney County Emergency Operations Plan**
 - Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS/SDS)
 - Hazardous chemical inventory forms
 - Listings of extremely hazardous substances manufactured, stored, or used within Finney County
